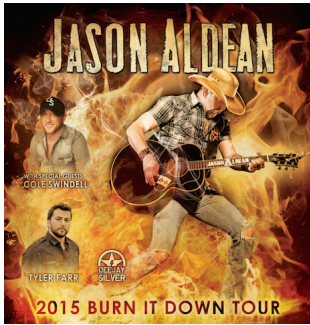
An Evening with Dave Matthews Band – Sept. 13

Janet Jackson: Unbreakable World Tour – Oct. 19

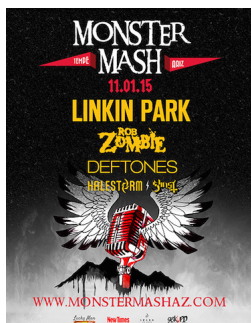
